So I was interested to read a book that claimed it was a must-read for all Bronte fans who wanted to know the truth. I have heard about the disputed authorship of the famous novel, and had never been convinced it was penned by any other than the named author, Branwells sister Emily. In this novel the case for alternative authorship is put forward from the perspective of a close friend of Branwells, the barber and poet George McCraw. The book features a letter sent by McCraw to the Halifax Courier in 1861, and uses this as a basis to delve into the barbers life in Victorian Bradford, the murky and polluted world of the city providing a suitably macabre backdrop for the events which unfold. The reader follows McCraw as he relives his past and present in a quest to reveal the true authorship of the work. Another interesting edge...
