Attached to the south-western angle, is to be seen one of a range of columns, which, now broken off, once ran across the court, forming a portico to the adjacent buildings. On entering the western door, the first object after the Turk, who is stationed on the left to take toll, is the Stone of Unction; to the right of which is the Chapel of Adam, or Godfrey, with the tombs of Godfrey de Bouillon and his successor Baldwin I. A flight of steps a little to the right ascends to the Chapel of Calvary, which is not much more than one hundred feet..
